OBJECTIVES, EXPECTATIONS AND GRADING

I. VISION STATEMENT

To create great musical moments with technical excellence and heart, forming a deeper sense of human connection. Members of this community are committed to the development of musical excellence in every form with passion, integrity, and leadership. This is a **performance-based class**. The material covered and the literature studied are directly related to this end and **attendance at all performances is of the highest importance**.

II. CLASS DESCRIPTION

This is a treble voices ensemble open to any student who have been part of the DV Choir program and auditioned or have been approved by the director. It is a **co-curricular class**, meaning that instruction occurs during the school day as well as on occasional nights and weekends.

III. EXPECTATIONS

- Punctual attendance at all class sessions
 - Tardies are disruptive and interrupt the progress of your learning and that of other students. Be sure to come to class on time, ready to learn. View the behavioral matrix here. Tardiness will be addressed in accordance with school policy as specified in the DVHS Student Handbook.
- Students will learn how to sight sing (or improve on their sight singing skills) using a variety of in person and online resources
- Assessments will be in the form of individual student portfolios that demonstrate growth as well as group projects and in class assessments.
- Students will actively participate in direct instruction and sectional rehearsals to improve their own musicianship.
- No food, drinks or candy/gum allowed during rehearsal.
- NO CELL PHONES DURING REHEARSAL UNLESS GIVEN INSTRUCTOR PERMISSION FOR AN ASSIGNMENT.
- All students will be prepared with their music in a folder (provided) and their own pencil
- Tardiness and school policy violations will be handled in accordance with the school rules and procedures outlined in the DVHS handbook
- ONE singer's mask PPE will be provided for each student. Students are expected to keep track of their own singer's mask and will be responsible for acquiring

IV. STUDENT BEHAVIORS WHICH AFFECT EARNED GRADE

A. Concert Attendance - "A missed live performance cannot be made up."

Every student is expected to participate and perform in every concert. Performances are the culmination of many hours of practice and classroom rehearsal. They are like summative assessments (finals) for the individual, but also represent a team effort. Any exception must be worked out, <u>IN WRITING</u>, with the director <u>AT LEAST TWO WEEKS PRIOR</u> to the event. Only severe illness and school or religious conflicts will be considered for absence from a required or scheduled event with adequate communication with the

director. Concerts include major performances, festivals, and competitions. Students who miss a concert or required event for an excused reason will receive a make-up assignment.

B. Participation

Students are expected to actively participate in all rehearsals, utilize online resources given by the teacher, and complete assignments with academic integrity by the indicated due date. Should a student be unable to do any of the above for any reason, the student needs to clearly communicate their situation with the teacher in a timely fashion.

Gum Chewing/Eating

Gum and eating are not allowed during any rehearsal. It interferes with good vocal technique and is a choking hazard. First offense will result in a warning and a reduction in participation points for all subsequent occurrences.

C. Performance Recording Uniforms/Grooming — Returning choir members will be wearing tuxedos and dresses coordinated and organized by the music director and music boosters. It is the student's responsibility to wear the appropriate concert attire for their performing group during performances. Concert attire specifications will be outlined at the New Parent Night as well as Back to School Night for students new to the choir program. It is the responsibility of each student to properly maintain their uniform including cleaning, pressing and mending. Students are also expected to be neatly groomed for performances. Long hair should be pulled back so the student's face can be seen clearly without any distractions. Make-up should be used tastefully. Small post style earrings are accepted. No hoops or sparkly earrings may be worn during concerts as it distracts from the entire ensemble. Students will receive assigned points for their uniform and grooming at all concert and may not be allowed to perform if they do not meet the stated standards.

V. OVERVIEW OF GRADING

- **30 %** Concert Attendance and Responsibilities Includes promptness and attendance at concert events as well as other responsibilities (set up, take down, rehearsals, etc.). Also includes all scheduled events such as concerts and special community performances.
- **30** % Participation and Attitude Determined by the student's actions while in rehearsals, performances, field trips, sectional meetings and while working with other students. Also includes rehearsal preparation.

- **20 %** <u>Class Work/Assignments/Special Projects</u> Includes musicianship lessons or assignments such as costume preparation, uniforms, deadlines, permission slips, activities (such as special performances) and related responsibilities (outfits and costumes, promptness, rehearsals, etc.).
 - 10 % Pod Projects Recorded choral performances in small groups will be required once every semester.
- **10%** Part Check Quizzes These singing samples will be given one to three times a quarter. Graded areas include note accuracy, tone quality, breathing, diction, memorization, etc.

Grading Scale

All report card grades will be given according to this scale:
